<b>Center Name and Code:</b>	Moraine Valley Community College (1524)
<b>Registration for CLEP:</b>	Please come to B260 to fill out a registration form and choose a test time. Submit registration forms and fees in person to the Academic Outreach Office, Room B260 at least two days prior to exam day. Register early to get your preferred date and time. Check B260 or <a href="http://www.morainevalley.edu/academicoutreach/dept.htm">www.morainevalley.edu/academicoutreach/dept.htm</a> for a list of current dates.
<b>Fees:</b>	<b>\$77</b> per test, check or money order payable to CLEP at registration or pay by major credit card on the day of the test. <b>\$15</b> nonrefundable service fee per test, check or money order payable to Moraine Valley Community College at registration. No cash.
<b>On Day of Test:</b>	Arrive in Testing Center, B101, Moraine Valley Community College, at least 15 minutes prior to exam start. Bring your registration form along with two forms of I.D.
<b>Results:</b>	The student is responsible for posting scores to his/her Moraine Valley transcript. To do this, complete a <b>Transfer Credit Evaluation Request</b> at Admissions in Building S, Room S101.

The College Board guide to the CLEP Examinations is a valuable resource that describes each CLEP test and offers sample questions.
