Student Right-to-Know Information on Graduation, Transfer-out, and Retention Rates

The following information is provided in compliance with federal regulations. The rates below reflect the graduation and transfer-out status of students who enrolled in 2012 and were tracked for three years.

During the fall semester of 2012, 1,560 first-time, full-time certificate or degree-seeking students entered Moraine Valley Community College. After three years (as of August 31, 2015):

- 26% had graduated from Moraine Valley
- 24% had transferred to another college without completing a degree
- 14% were still enrolled at Moraine Valley

Graduation rates are also reported for students receiving athletically-related student aid. During the fall semester of 2012, 24 first-time, full-time athletes entered the college. After three years:

- 38% had graduated from Moraine Valley
- 42% had transferred to another college without completing a degree
- 0% were still enrolled at Moraine Valley

While reviewing this information, please be aware that graduation rates are affected by a number of factors. Some students leave because their career goals changed and some leave when they get a job. Some may leave because of academic deficiencies. Some students begin full-time but are unable to continue attending full-time and thus need more than three years to graduate.

During the fall semester of 2014, 1,681 first-time, full-time students and 519 first-time, part-time students entered Moraine Valley Community College. After one year (as of Fall 2015 census):

- 66% of first-time, full-time students returned to Moraine Valley
- 40% of first-time, part-time students returned to Moraine Valley
