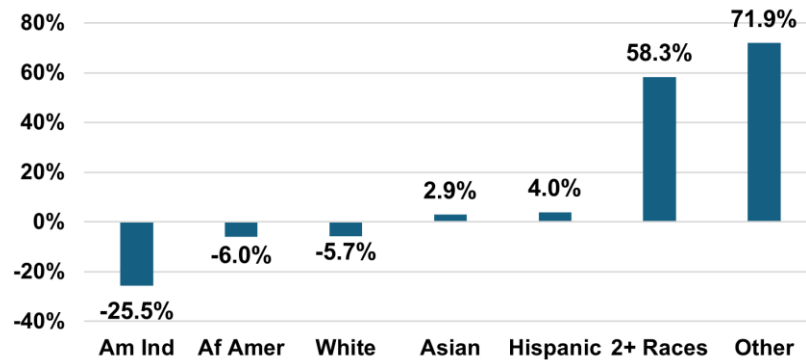
PROFILE OF DISTRICT DEMOGRAPHICS

- 26 communities
- From 2019 to 2023, the estimated population remained flat from 387,166 to 386,651, with a decrease of only 515 people.
 - The largest population decline was in Calumet Park (-16.7%) and the largest increase in Hickory Hills (6.5%).
 - Slightly more than half the towns saw a decrease (54%) in population.
- From the 2021 to 2022 Estimates, the Hispanic population has increased from an estimated 85,290 to 86,932 (1.9%).
- The Hispanic population in MVCC district made up 22 percent of the population while African Americans comprised 12 percent.
- Among specific communities:
Hispanics have a sizable population in Summit (75.9%) and Burbank (49.7%). African-Americans predominate in Robbins and Calumet Park (85.1% and 80.7%, respectively).
- The district's median household income in 2023 was \$82,494 with the city of Robbins having the lowest income (\$37,594) and Palos Park having the highest (\$126,263).
- Per capita income for the district in 2023 was \$39,939, with the city of Robbins having the lowest income (\$19,628) and Palos Park having the highest (\$83,594).
- Moraine Valley's district's median income (\$82,494) and per capita income (\$39,939) were higher than both Cook County and Illinois.
- People ages 65+ was the largest age cohort in the district with 18.5% falling into this group, higher than the Illinois (16.5%).
- 89.3 percent of the population aged 25 and older have high school diplomas or higher and 39.0 percent have an Associate Degree or higher.
- 3.1 percent of district residents aged 18+ attended Moraine Valley in fall 2024.
- Unemployment rates for September 2024 increased less than one percent for most large in-district communities.
- The in-district community had a poverty rate of 10.3%, which was lower than both Cook County (13.3%) and Illinois (11.7%).
- Within the community, Robbins had the highest poverty rate (33.5%) followed by Worth (21.1%) and Justice (21.0%). Four communities saw less than 5.5% poverty rate: Willow Springs (5.1%), Tinley Park (5.2%), Evergreen Park (5.3%), and Oak Forest (5.4%).

Population Changes by Race/Ethnicity and Age – Cook County

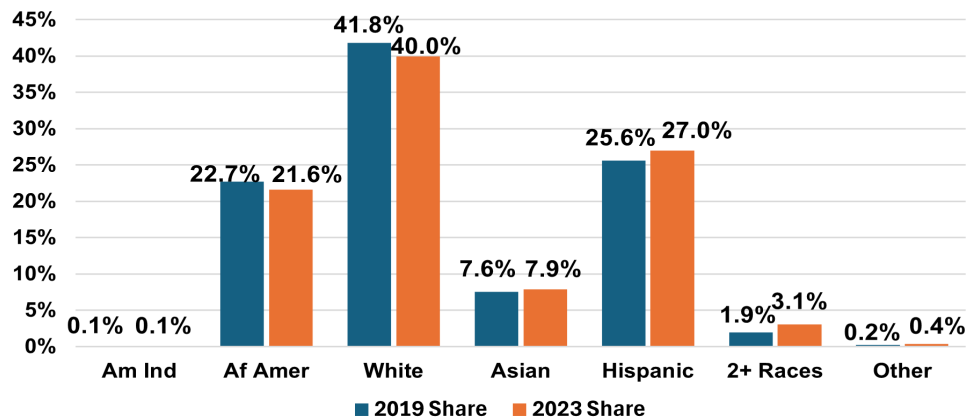
Each year we are able to look at trends over time at the county level. At this level, we can use the one-year American Community Survey (ACS), a product of the Census, allowing us to better understand trends over time. This is particularly useful over the last five years since we can see changes to the county from before and after the COVID-19 Pandemic

by Race/Ethnicity in Cook County**



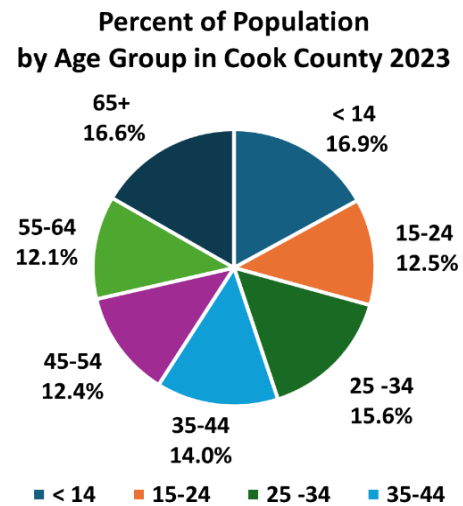
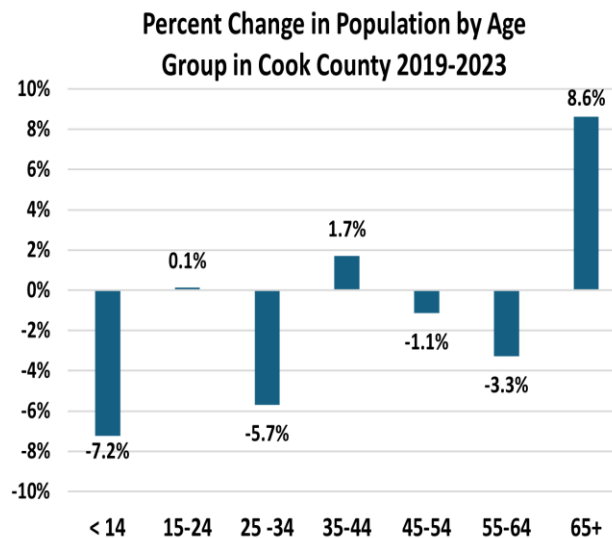
Over this five-year period, Cook County saw a decline in its African American (-6.0%) and White population (-5.7%), though this loss increased slightly from the previous five years. The Asian population grew slightly (2.9%). Hispanics grew as well (4.0%) and people who identified as two or more races or identified as another race grew tremendously (58.3% and 71.9%, respectively). However, this growth was not enough to counteract declines among African American and White residents, so overall the county declined by 63,161 people, or 1.2%.

by Race/Ethnicity in Cook County**

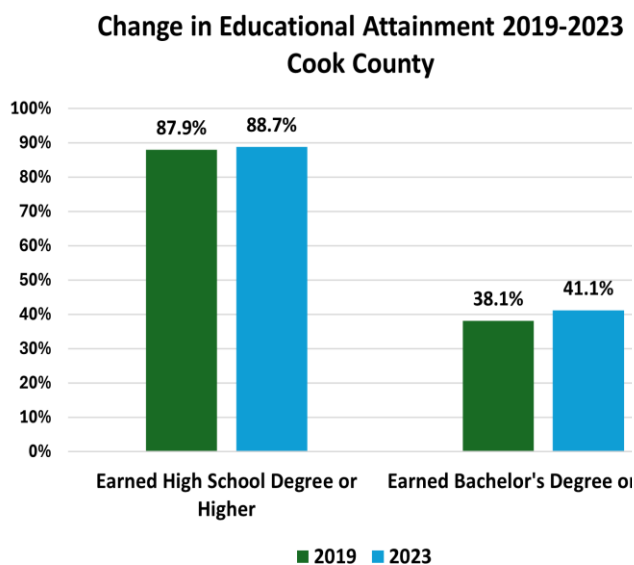


The White population is still the largest in Cook County even though it had a smaller percent share of the population than five years ago (from 41.8% to 40.0%). The African American population also had a smaller percent share as well (from 22.7% to 21.6%). Hispanics, Asians, and those of two or more races each represent a growing share of the county.

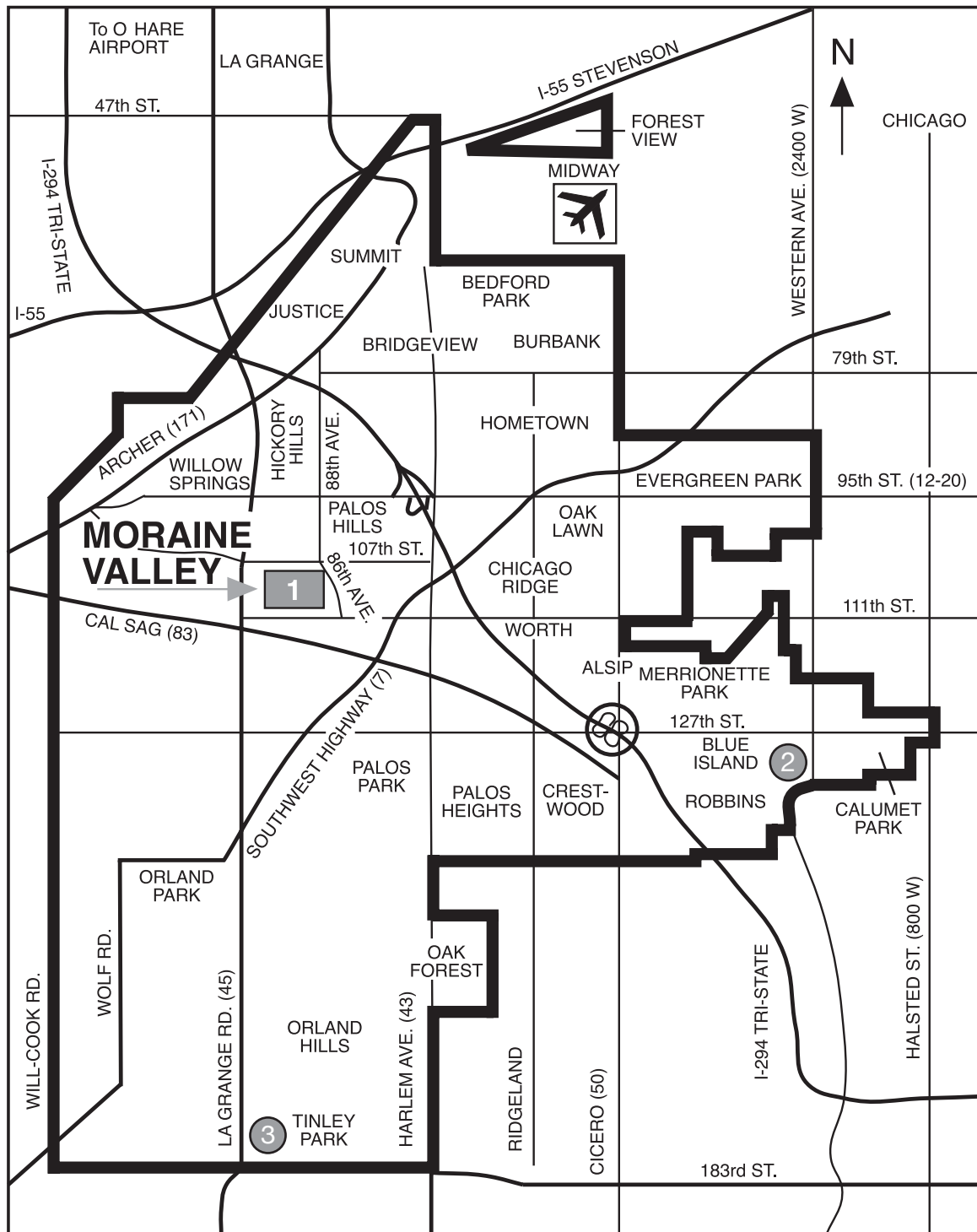
Age Group Population and Educational Attainment Changes – Cook County



Overall, the population of Cook County declined by 1.2%, or 63,161 people between 2019 and 2023. Most age groups saw decline. The largest decline was seen in children under 14 years of age with a drop of 7.2%. Specifically, young children under five years of age saw a dramatic decline of 14.4%. However, there was a relatively large growth among people 65 years or older at 8.6%. Children under 14 years of age and residents who are 65 and older both had the largest age group in Cook County accounting for 16.9% and 16.6%, respectively, of the population.



Educational attainment has inched up in the County over the last five years. The percentage of people with at least a high school degree has risen from 87.9% to 88.7%, while the percentage of people with at least a bachelor's degree has risen from 38.1% to 41.1%.

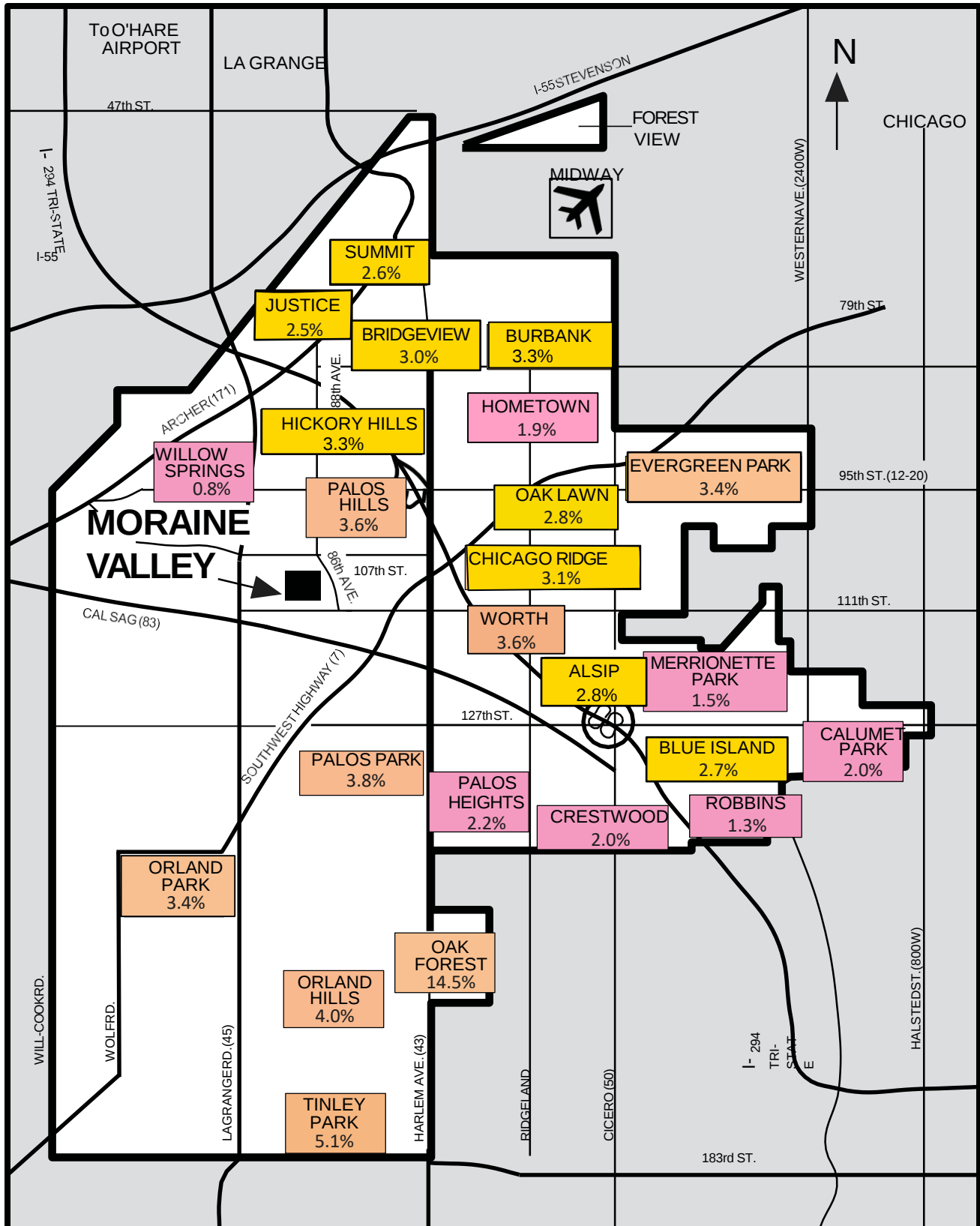

Education & Employment

Projections of Education Statistics to 2031

National Elementary and Secondary Enrollment

- ◆ Public elementary and secondary enrollment is projected to decrease 5.5 percent from 49.6 million in 2022 to 46.9 million in 2031.
- ◆ Private elementary and secondary enrollment is projected to decrease 10.6 percent from 4.5 million in 2019 to 3.5 million in 2031.

Midwest and Illinois, Elementary and Secondary Enrollment

- ◆ In the Midwest, public elementary and secondary enrollment is projected to decrease 5 percent.
- ◆ In Illinois, total public elementary and secondary enrollment is projected to decrease by 7.4 percent from 2022 to 2031, ranking 35th out of 50 states and the District of Columbia (up from 44th in 2016). Forty states are predicted to decrease in enrollment from 2022 to 2031 (80%). The state of Idaho had the highest projected increase of 10.8 percent. The states of California and Hawaii had the lowest projection with a 16.0 percent decrease.

High School Graduates

- ◆ Nationally, the total number of high school graduates is projected to decrease by 4.2 percent (from 3.74 million to 3.58 million) between 2018-19 and 2031-32. Public high school graduates are expected to decrease by 4.7 percent while private high school graduates are expected to remain flat with a slight increase 1/2 percent in 2031-32 than in 2018-19.
- ◆ Public high school graduates in Illinois are projected to decrease by 8.2 percent. Sixty percent of all 50 states are projected to decrease in the number of public high school graduates. North Dakota and Idaho are projected to increase the most with 16.9 and 16.0 percent, respectively. West Virginia and Mississippi are projected to decrease the most by 21.8 and 21.9 percent, respectively.

College Enrollment

- ◆ Nationally, total college enrollment is expected to increase from 18.58 million in 2022 to 20.23 million in 2031 (8.9%).
- ◆ Four-year enrollments are expected to increase 7.1 percent while two-year enrollments are projected to increase 12.4 percent between 2021 and 2031.
- ◆ Public college enrollment is expected to increase 9.6 percent whereas private college enrollment projections are 7.1 percent increase in 2031 from 2022.
- ◆ Projected college enrollment between 2022 and 2031 by race are: 31.6 percent increase for Hispanic students, 23.7 percent increase for Black, 1.0 percent increase for White, 5.4 percent decrease for American Indian/Alaskan Native, and 6.5 percent decrease for Asian/Pacific Islander.
- ◆ College enrollment projections for those between 22-24 are expected to increase the highest at 17.2 percent, followed by students between the ages of 25-29 and 35 and older by 12.0 percent and 11.8 percent, respectively, ages 20-21 by 8.8 percent, ages 18-19 and 30-34 by 5.8 percent.
- ◆ Part-and full-time college students are expected to increase by 10.5 and 7.9 percent, respectively.
- ◆ Female students are expected to increase by 9.6 percent while male student enrollments are expected to increase by 8.0 percent.

Associate and Bachelor's Degrees

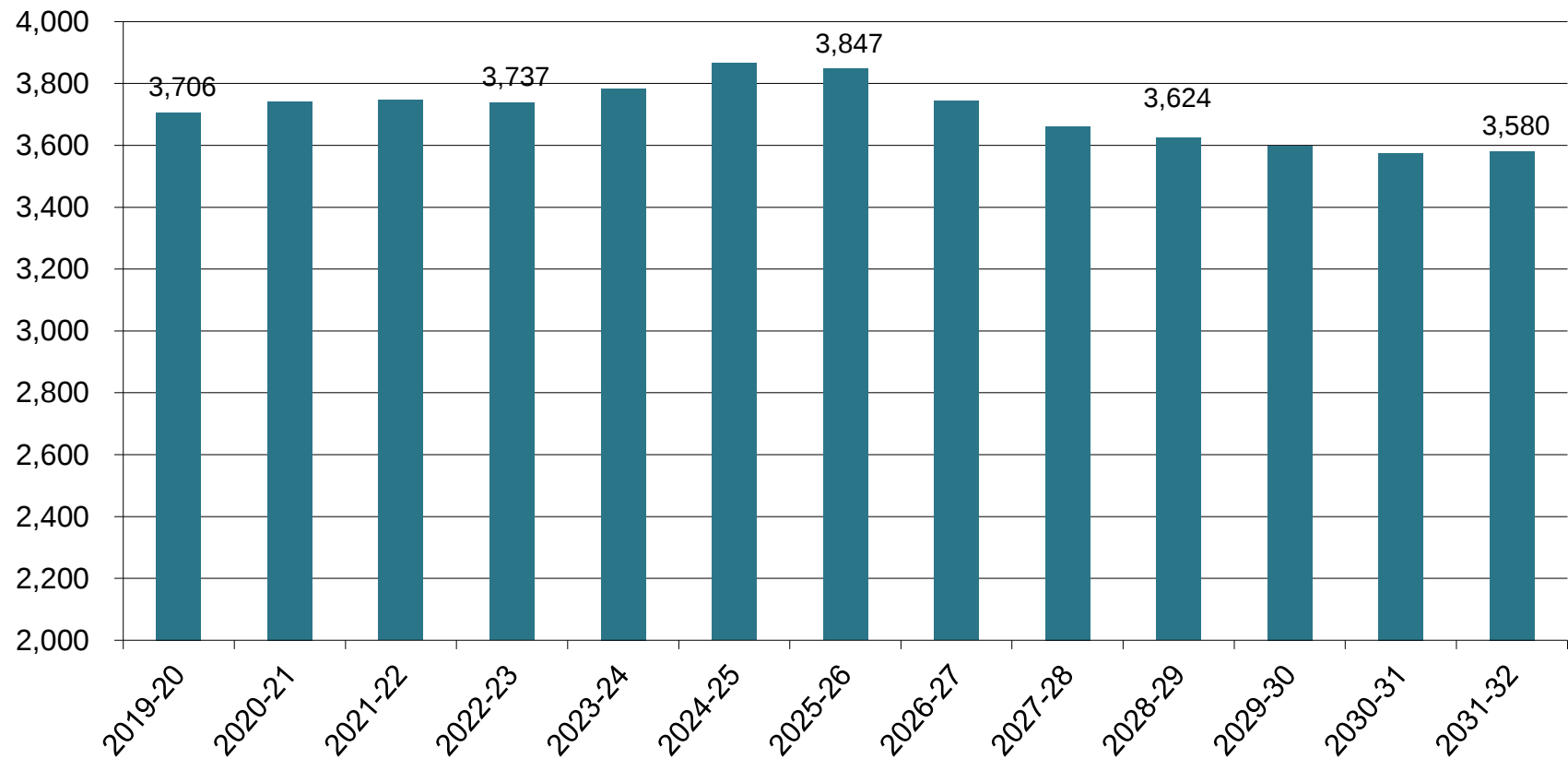
- ◆ The number of bachelor's degrees earned is expected to increase from 2.1 million in 2020-2021 to 2.5 million by 2031-2032 (19.3%) and the number of associate's degrees earned is expected to increase from 1.04 million in 2020-2021 to 1.14 million by 2031-2032 (9.9%).

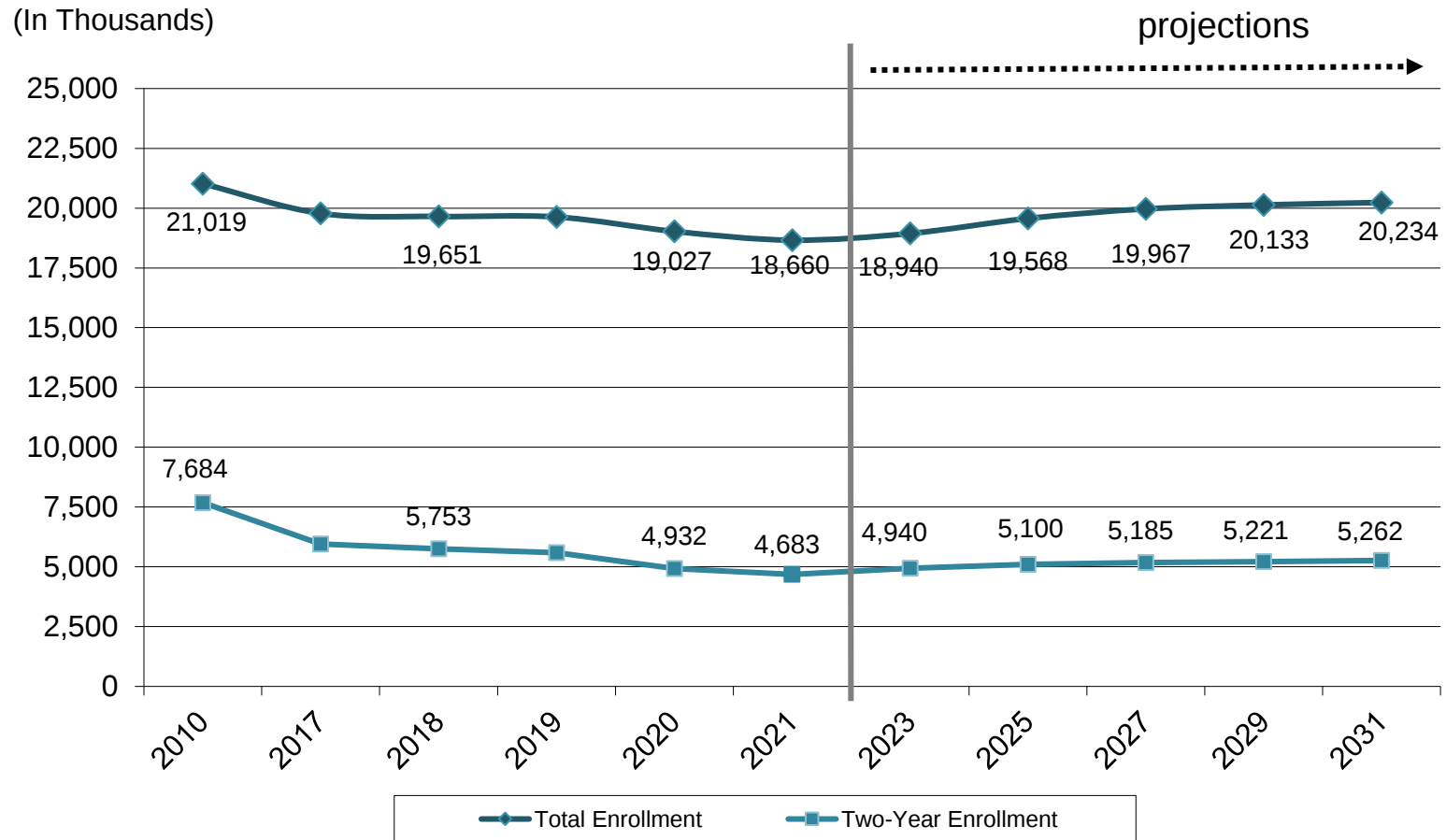
National Projections of High School Graduates 2019-20 to 2031-32

National College Enrollment 2010, 2017-21 and Projections 2023 - 2031



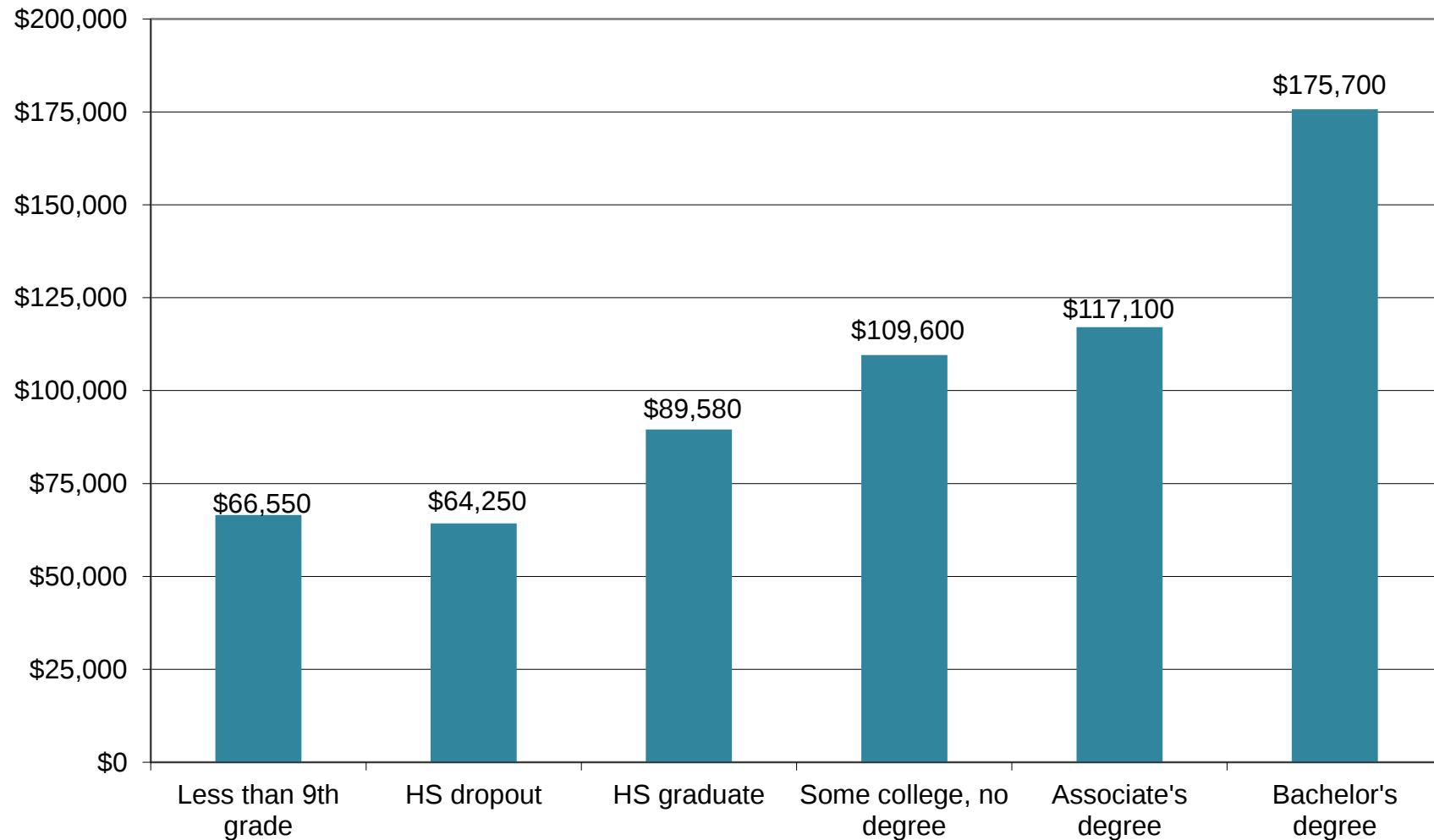

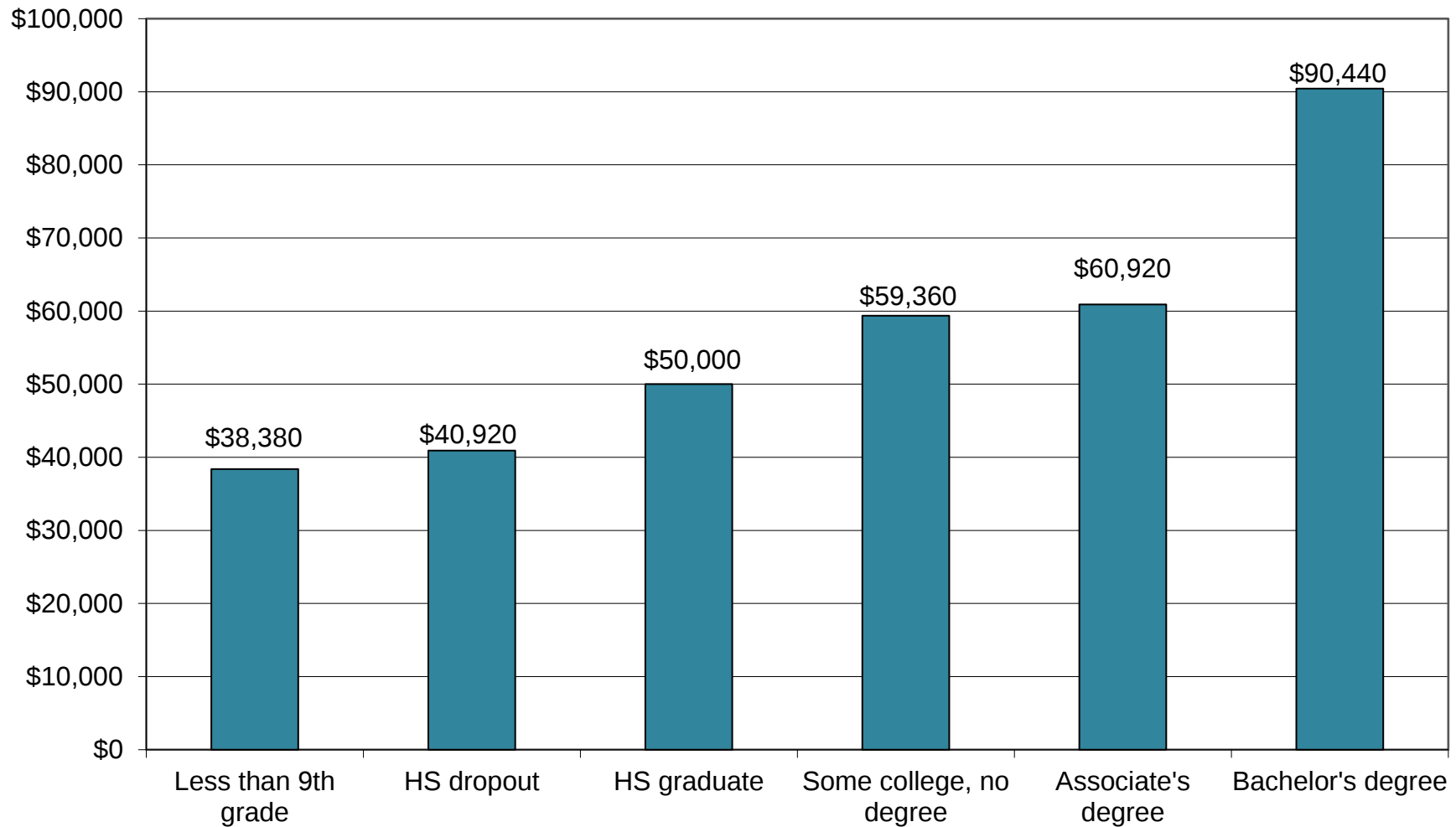

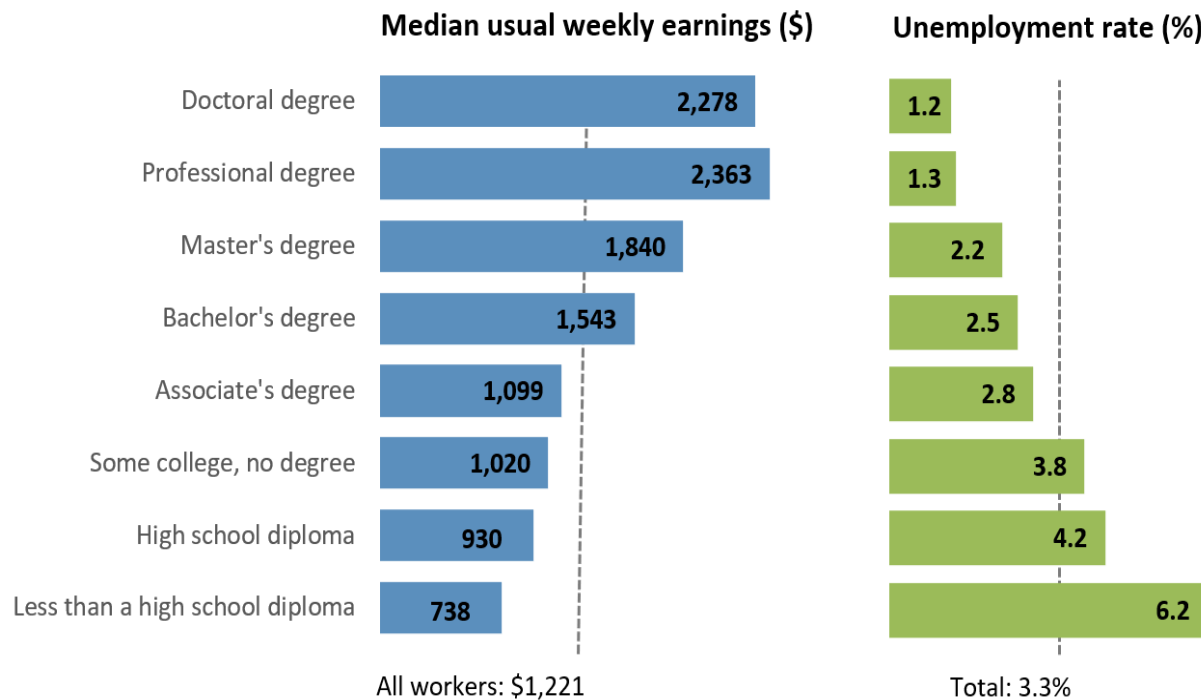
Average Individual Earnings (National) by Educational Attainment - 2023



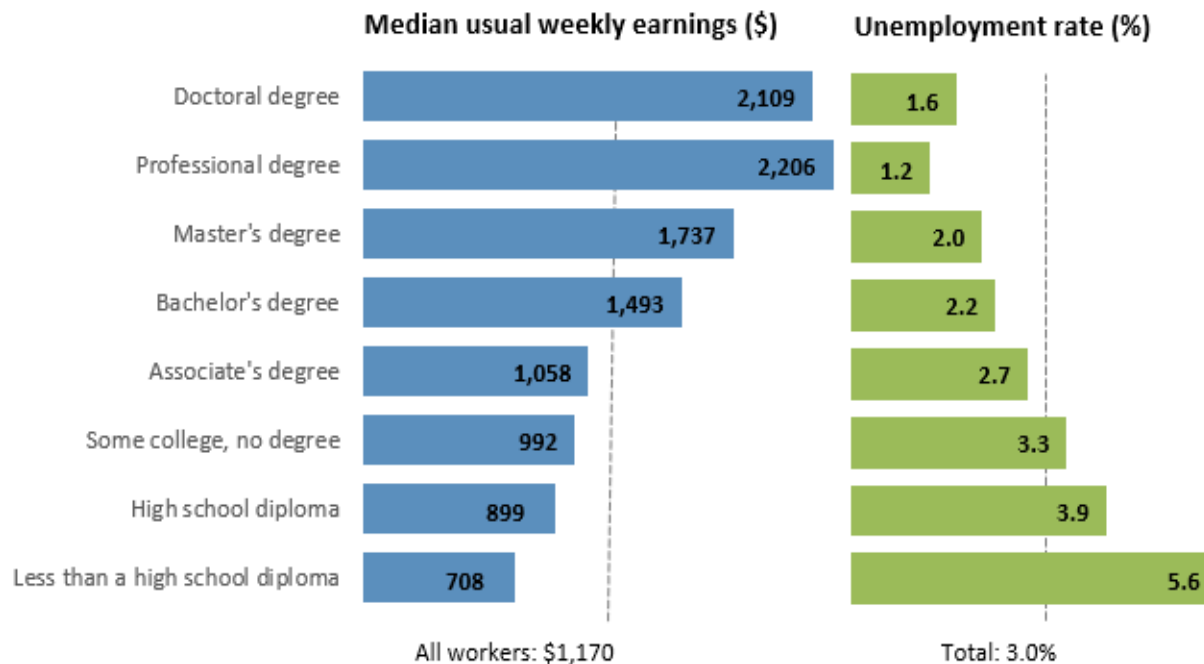

Illinois, Cook County and Surrounding Counties, and Moraine Valley District Unemployment at a Glance

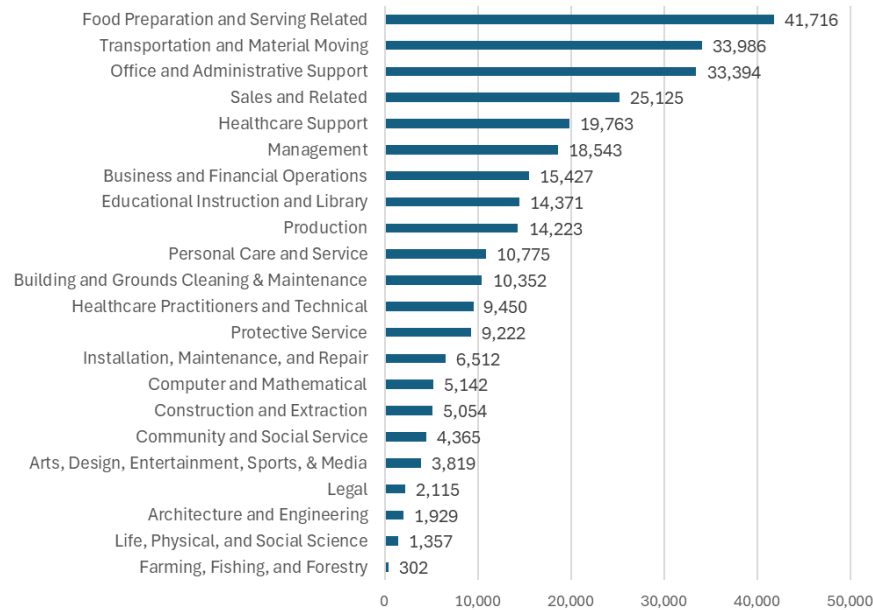
- The one-year levels of **Illinois** statewide unemployment from September 2023 to September 2024 remained the same at 4.7% increasing slightly from 303,307 to 315,626. About 12,319 additional people were unemployed during this period.
- **Illinois** saw the highest number of unemployed workers during this period in June and July 2024, both at 5.7% (383,655 and 382,859 unemployed workers, respectively).
- Statewide, the unemployment during 2024 ranged from 4.3% (December) to 5.7% (June and July)
- In **Cook County**, the unemployment rate increased from 4.8% in September 2023 to 5.4% in September 2024. The highest unemployment rate for Cook County during this period was in June 2024 (6.5%).
- All surrounding counties had an unemployment rate between 4 and 5 percent with all counties seeing a percentage point difference from last year of less than 1%. **Lake** increased 0.8 percentage points from 3.4% to 4.2%. **DuPage** increased by 0.7 percentage points to 4.3%, **Kane, McHenry**, and **Will County** increased 0.4 percentage point (to 4.1%, 4.3%, and 4.8, respectively).
- For all the surrounding communities, **Burbank** saw the highest increase of 1.3 percentage points from 4.0% to 5.3%, followed by **Tinley Park** (0.8 percentage points from 4.1% to 4.9%), **Oak Lawn** (0.6 percentage points from 4.8% to 5.4%), **Orland Park** (0.6 percentage points from 3.8% to 4.4%), and **Oak Forest** (0.3 percentage points from 4.3% to 4.6%). **Evergreen Park** was the only town whose employment rates remained the same as last year but also the highest of the surrounding communities (5.7%).
- From September 2023 to September 2024, the **Chicago** area's unemployment rate saw a minimal increase in unemployment rates from 5.2% to 5.6%.
- The national one-year levels of unemployment from September 2023 to September 2024 remained the same at 4.7%. The unemployment rate fluctuated from a low of 4.2% to a high of 5.7% during this period.

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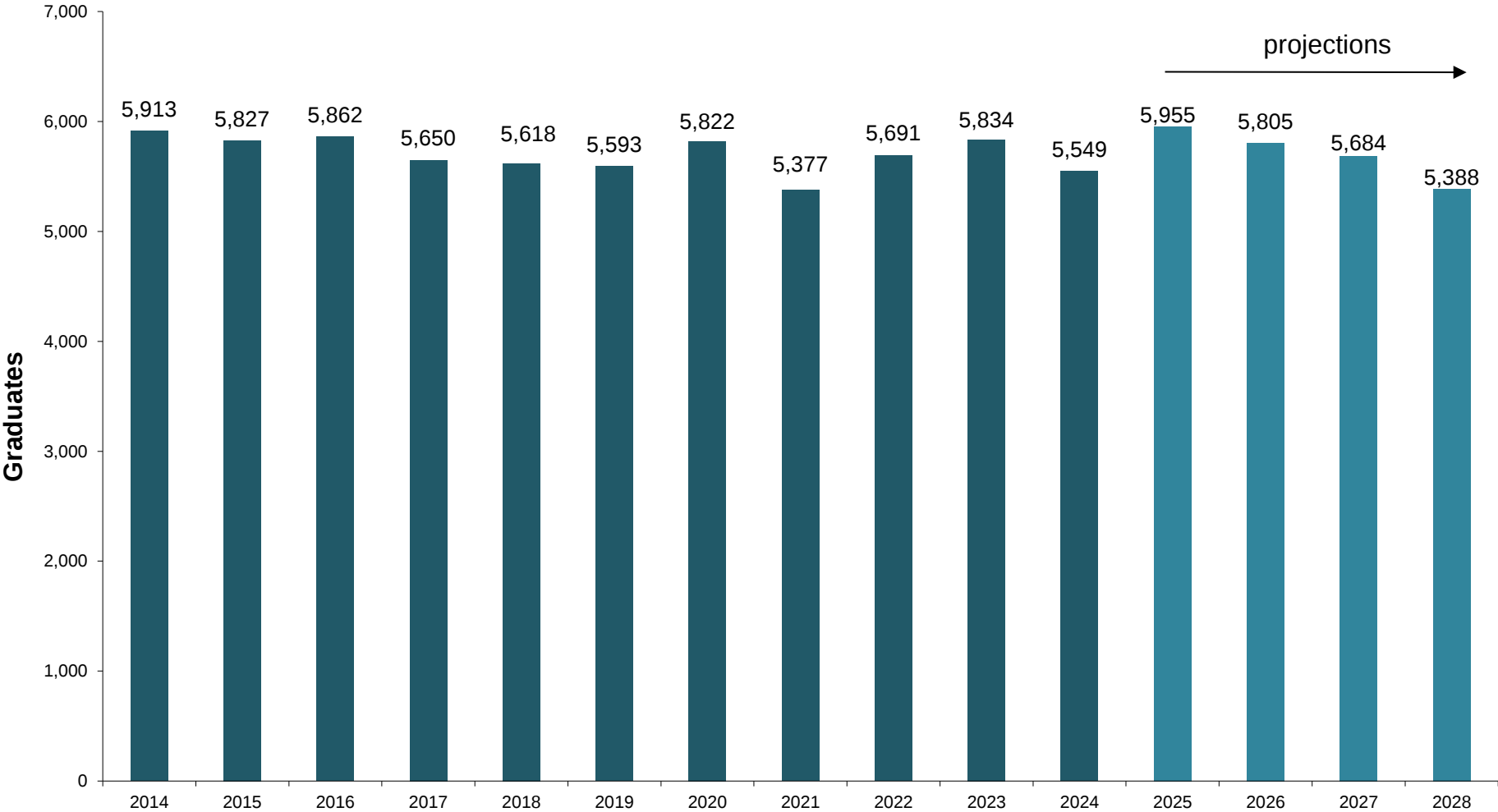

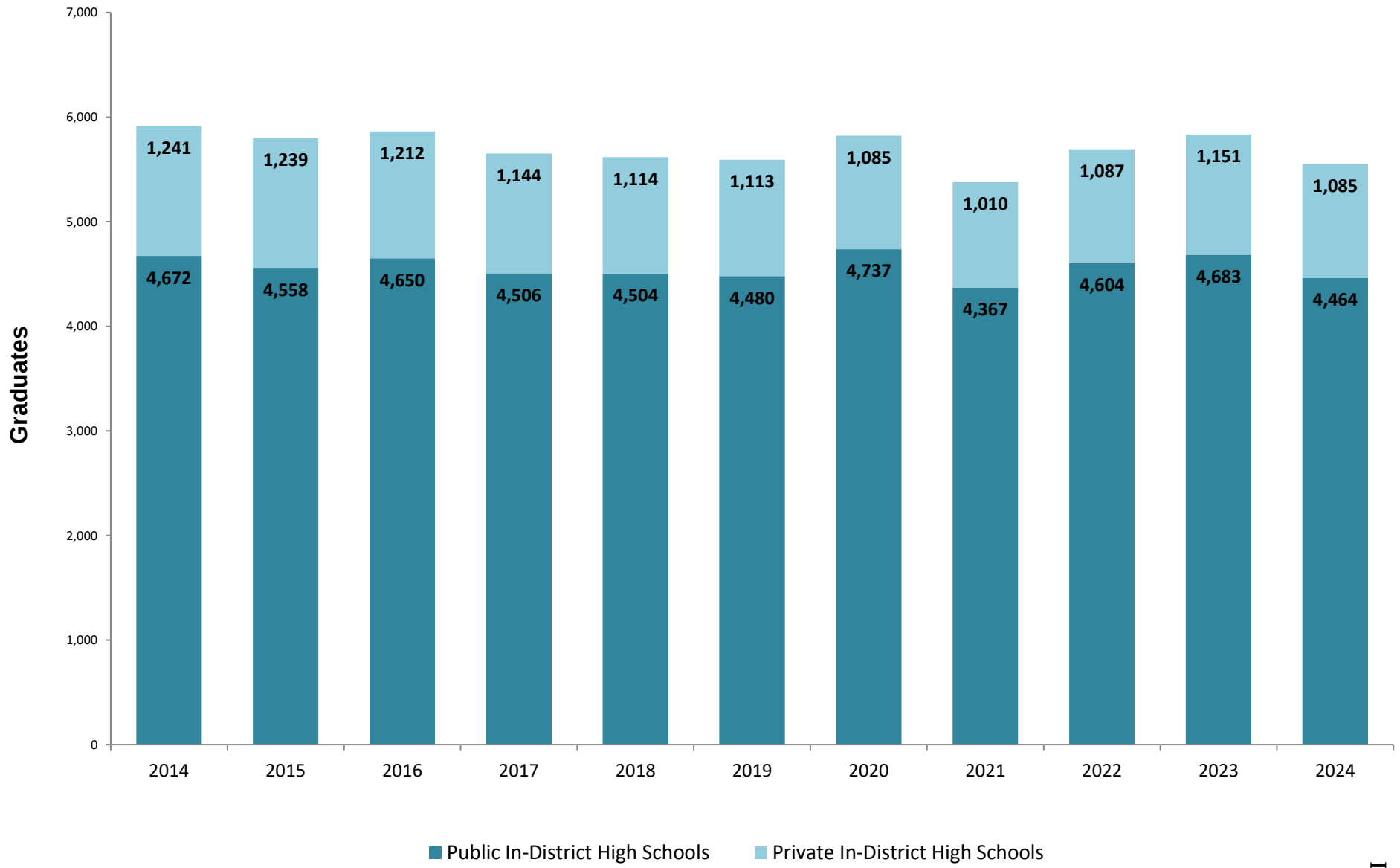

2014 to 2024 and Projections 2025 to 2028**



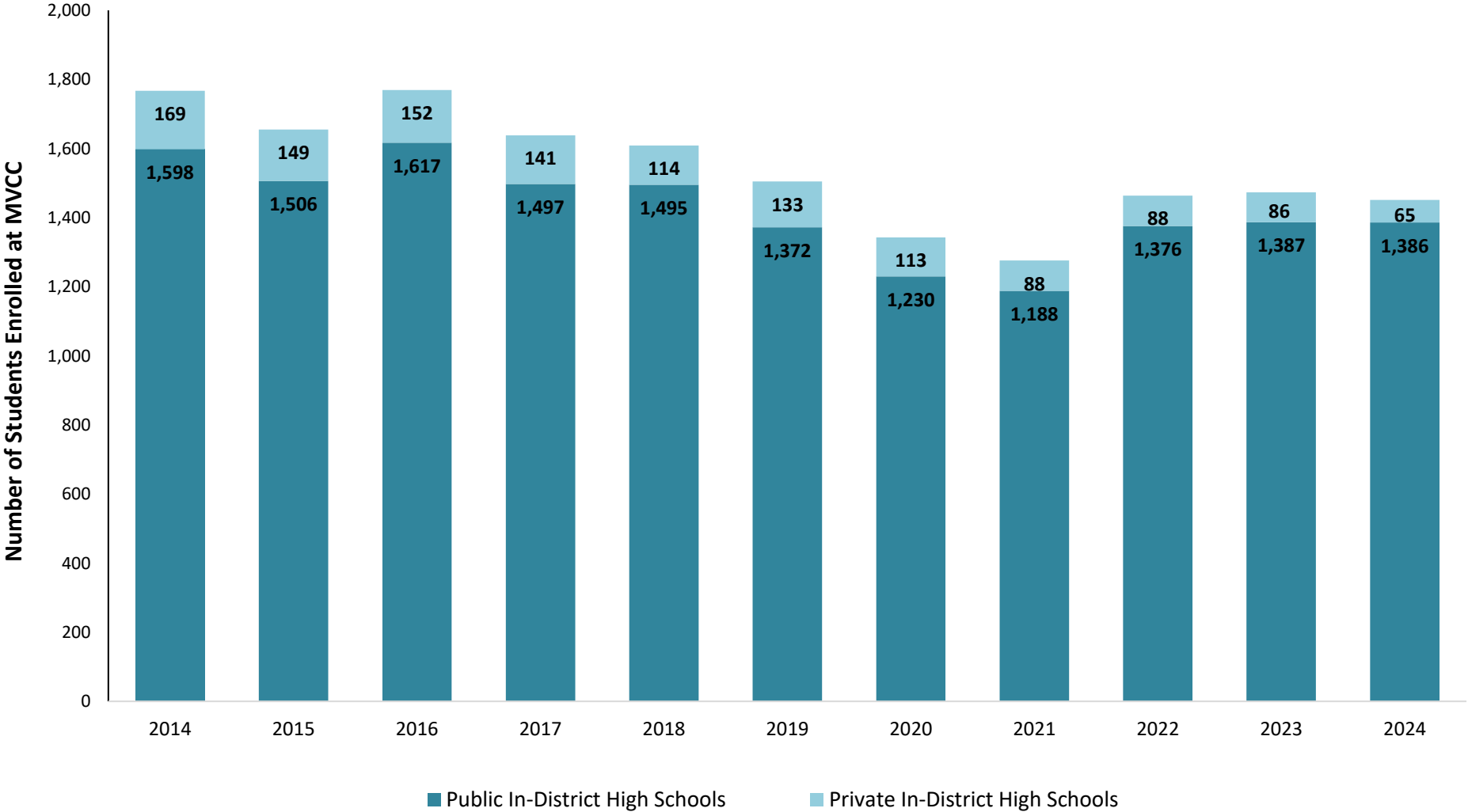
Number of Graduates from In-District High Schools Public Versus Private (2014-2024)



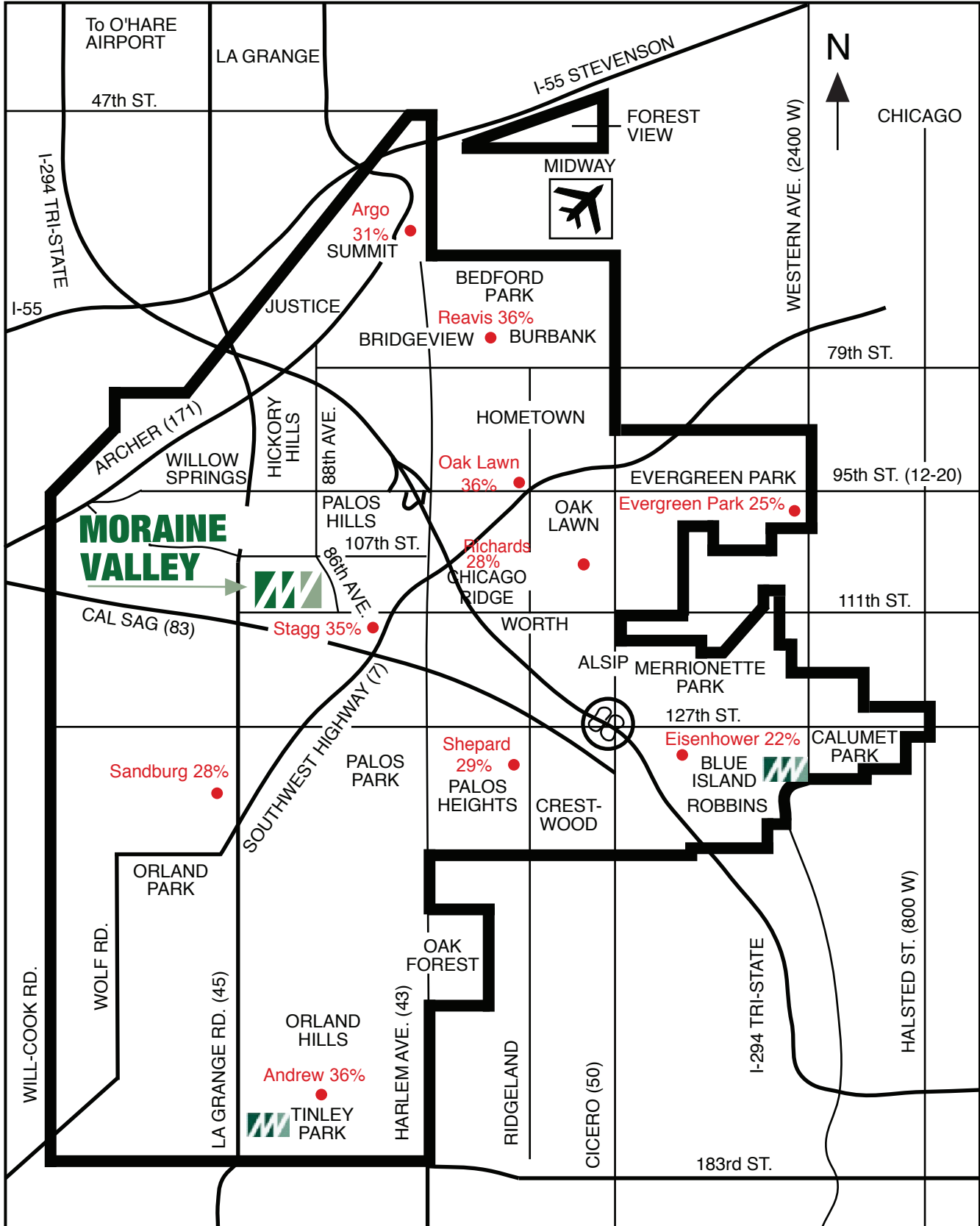

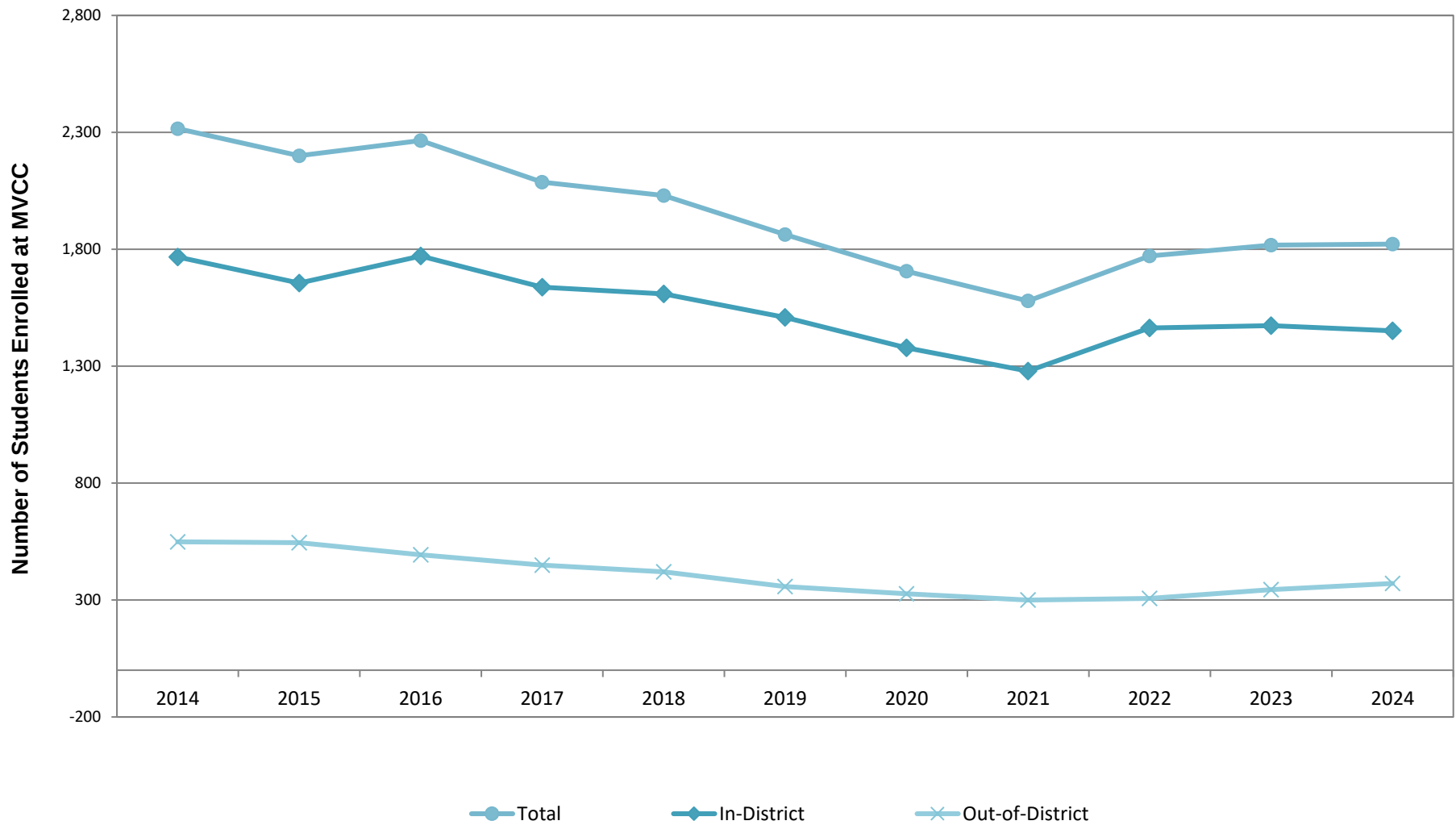
**Number of Graduates from In-District High Schools Enrolled at Moraine Valley

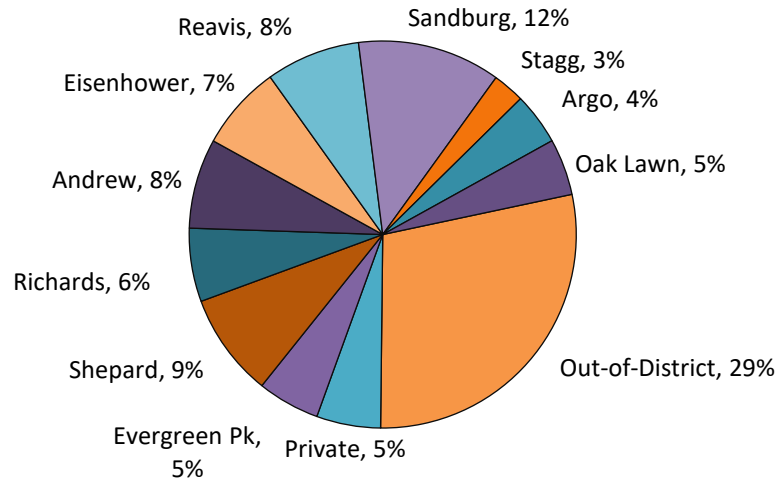

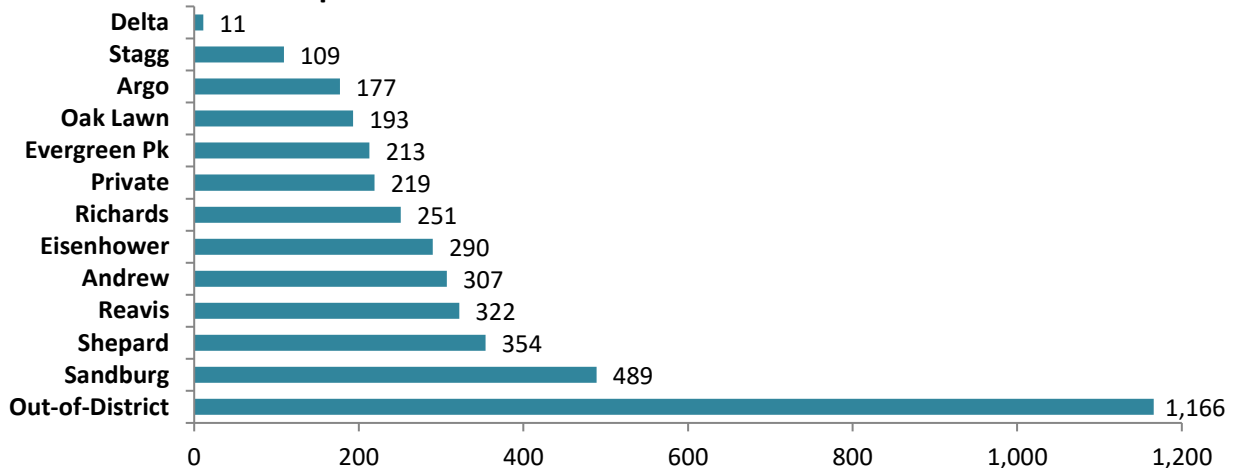

Dual Credit Career & Technical Education (CTE) Students by High School for FY 2024

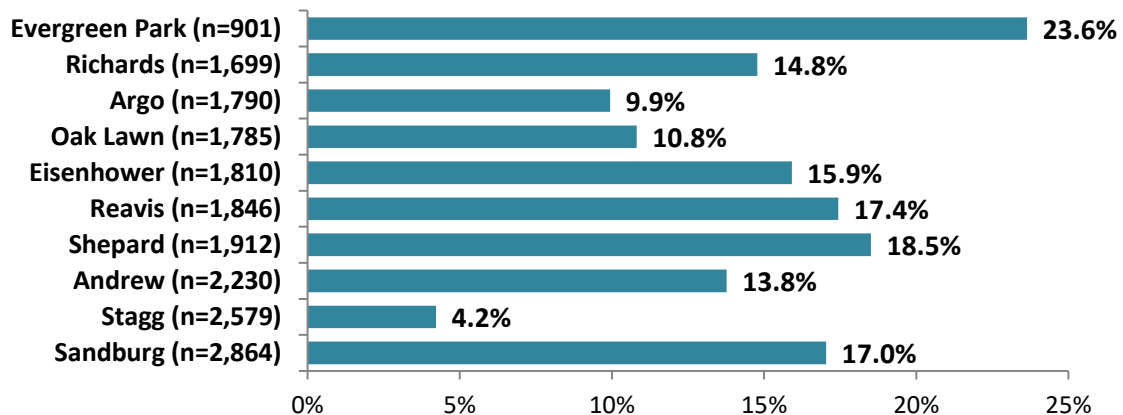
Percentage of Dual Credit CTE Students (n=4,101)



Unduplicated Number of Dual Credit CTE Students



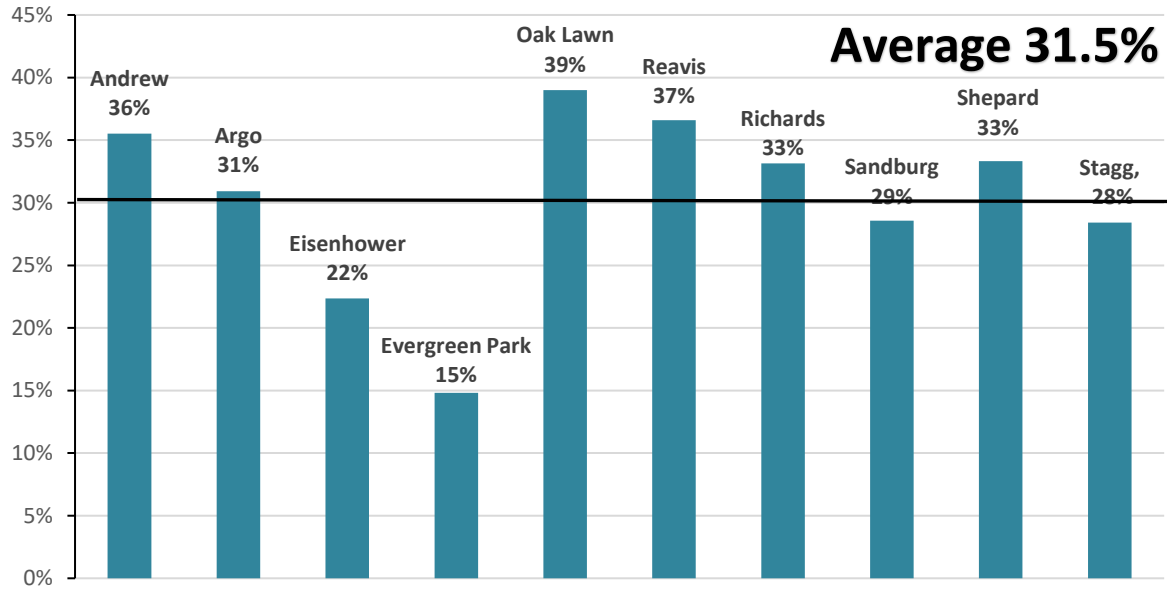
Percentage of High School Students Participating in Dual Credit CTE
Courses



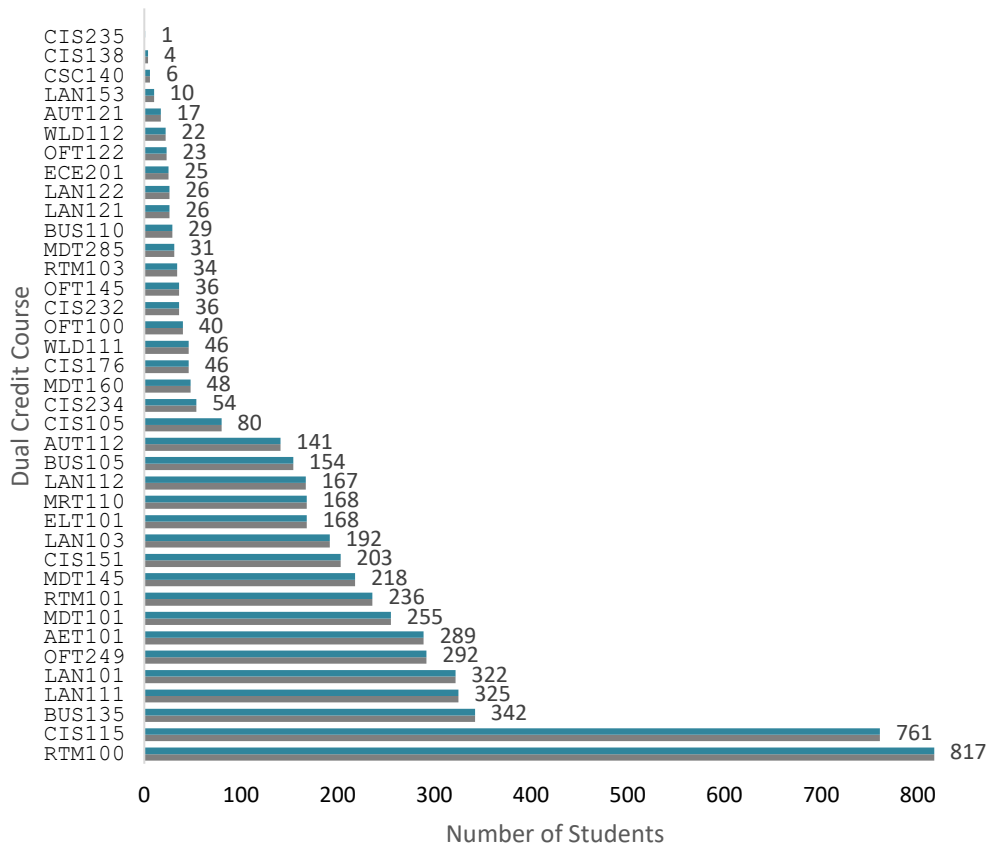

Percentage of In-District CTE Students Graduating in 2024 & Attending Moraine Valley in Fall 2024 by High School

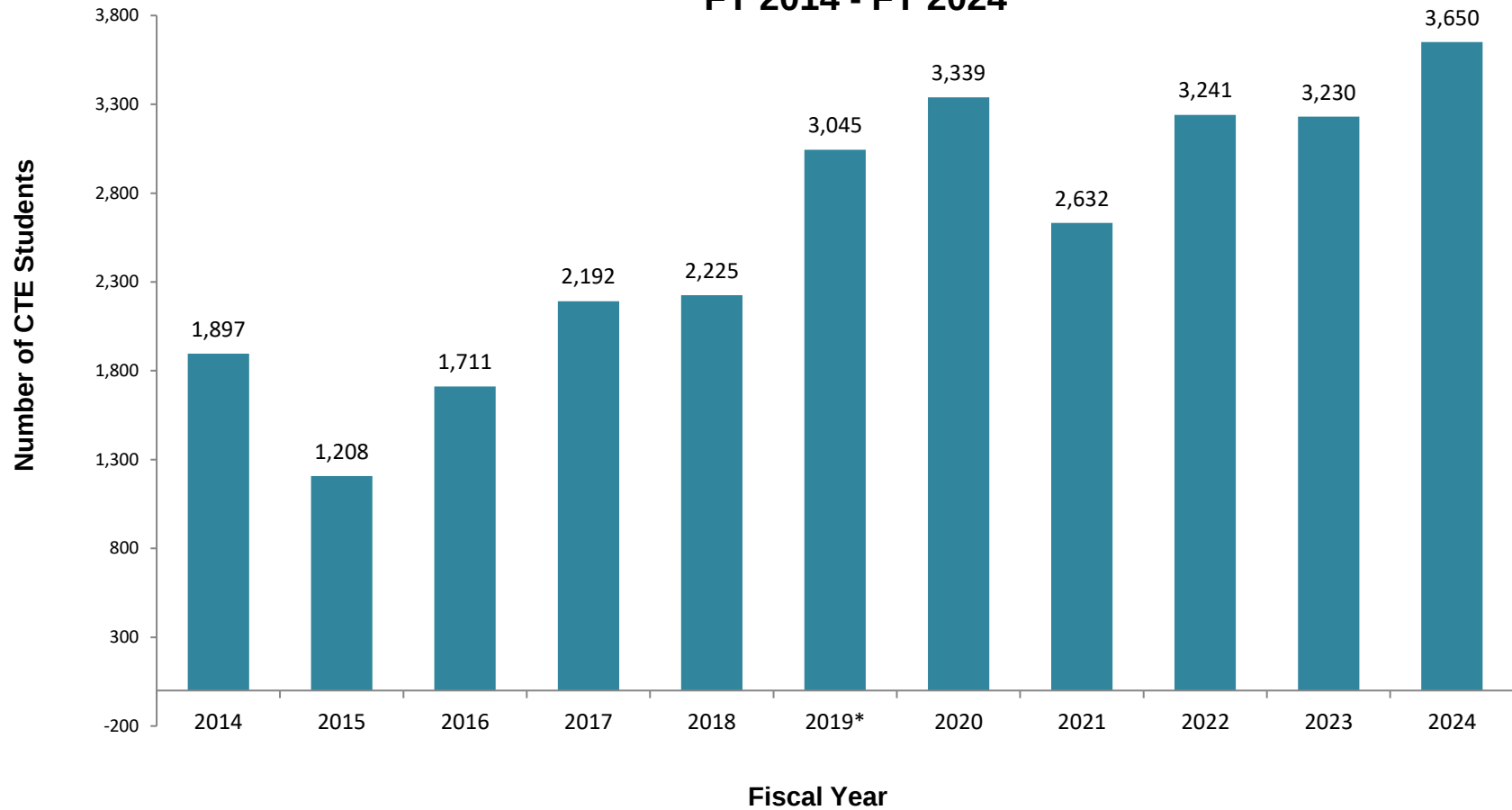


Number of Dual Credit CTE Courses Taken

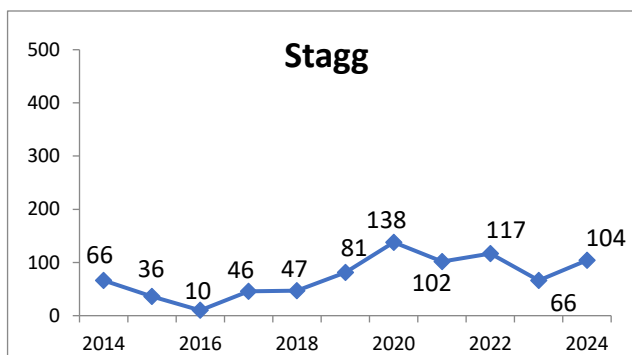
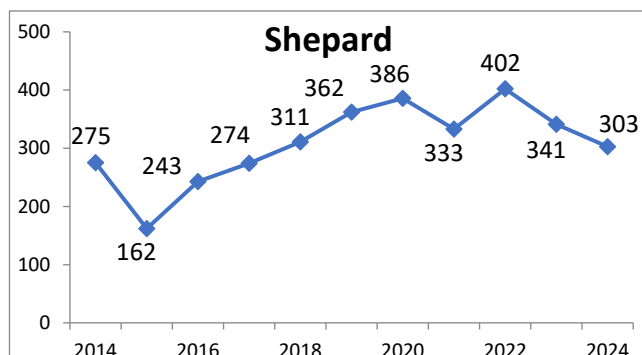
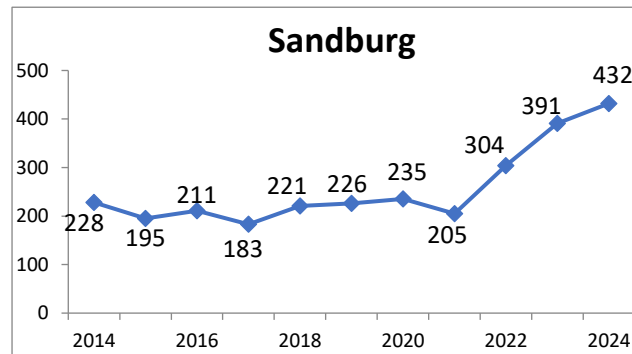
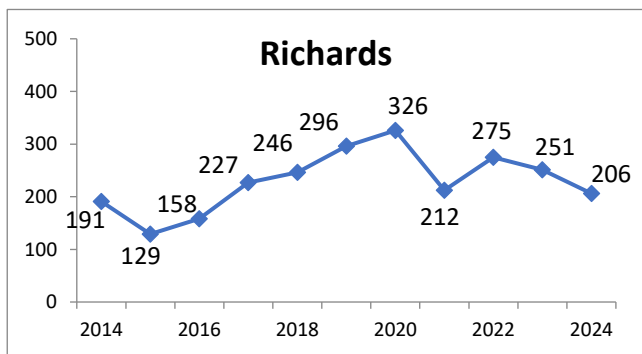
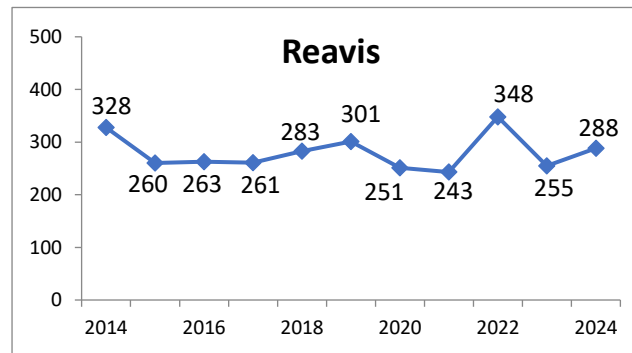
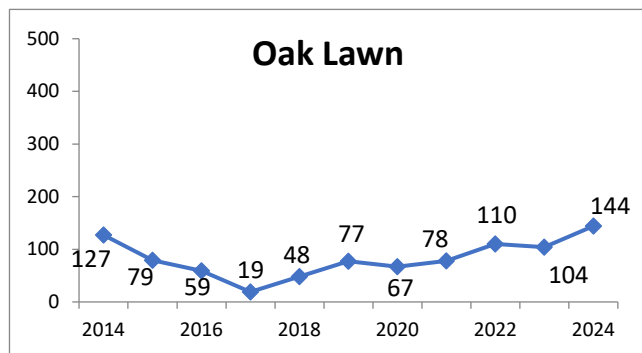
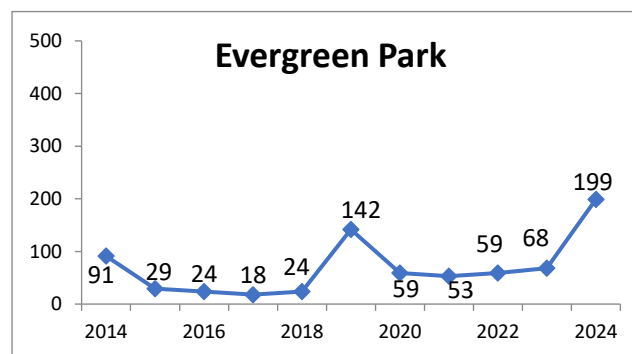
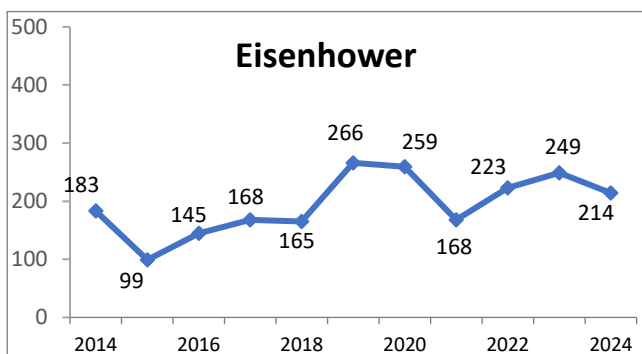
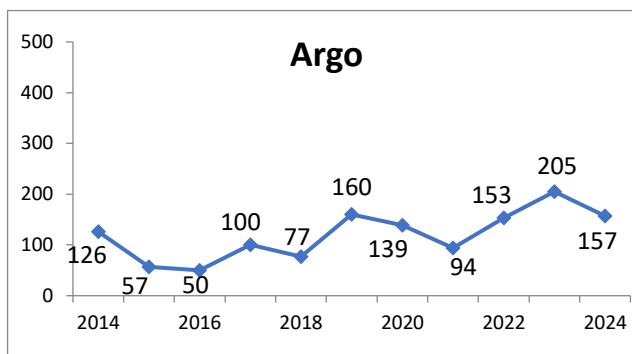
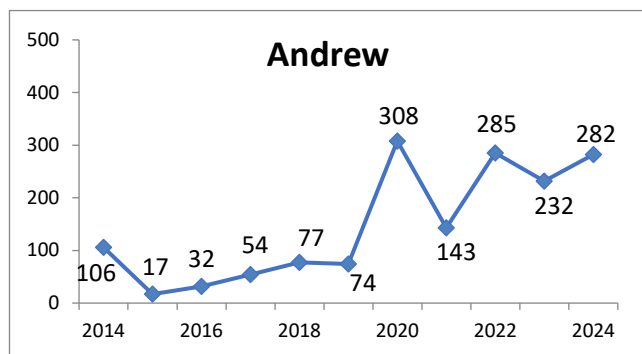
**Number of Unduplicated High School Students

Moraine Valley CTE Dual Credit Students Earning College Credit by High School FY 2014 - FY 2024

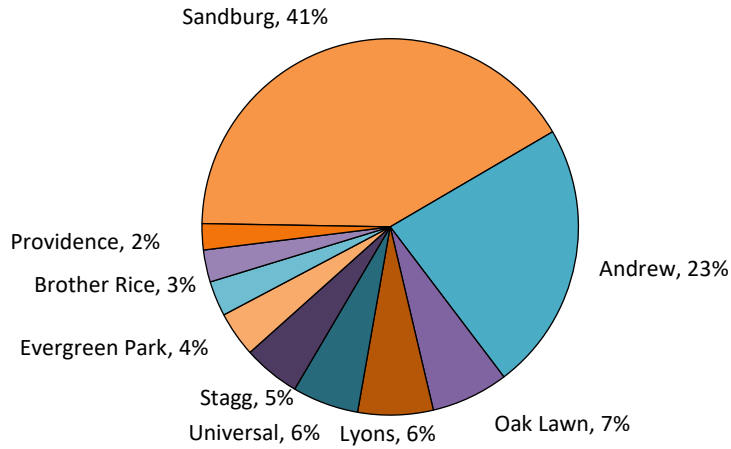

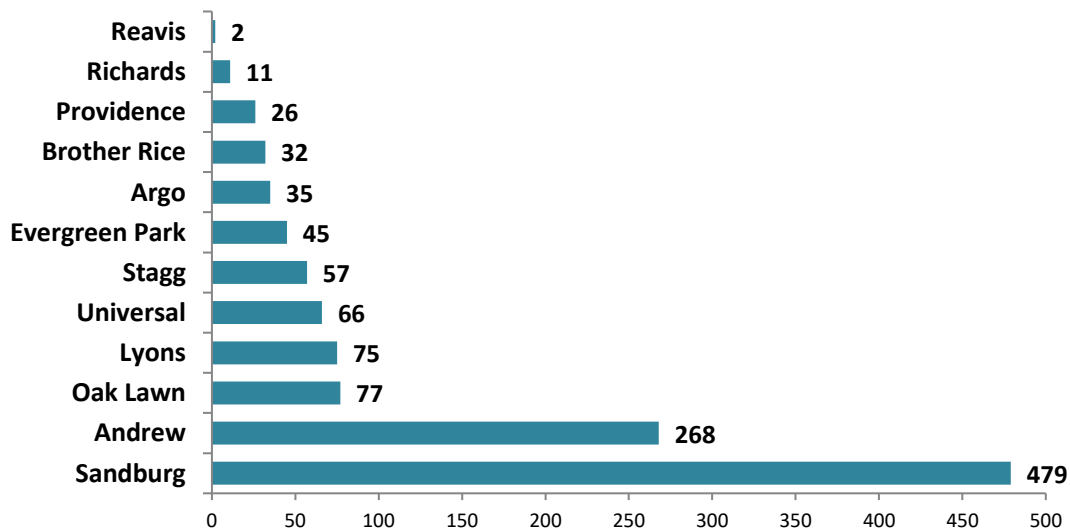

Percentage of Dual Credit Gen Ed Students (n=1,173)

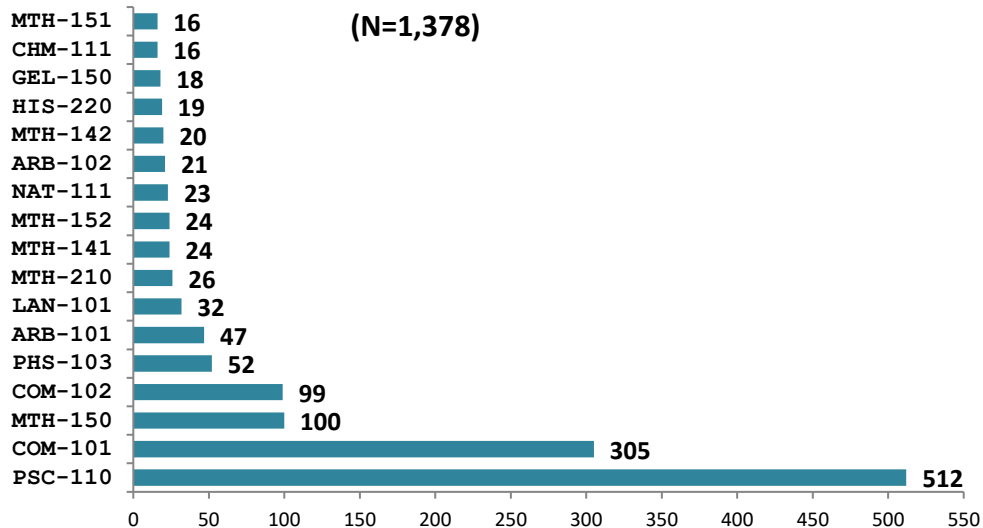


Unduplicated Number of Dual Credit Gen Ed Students (n=1,173)

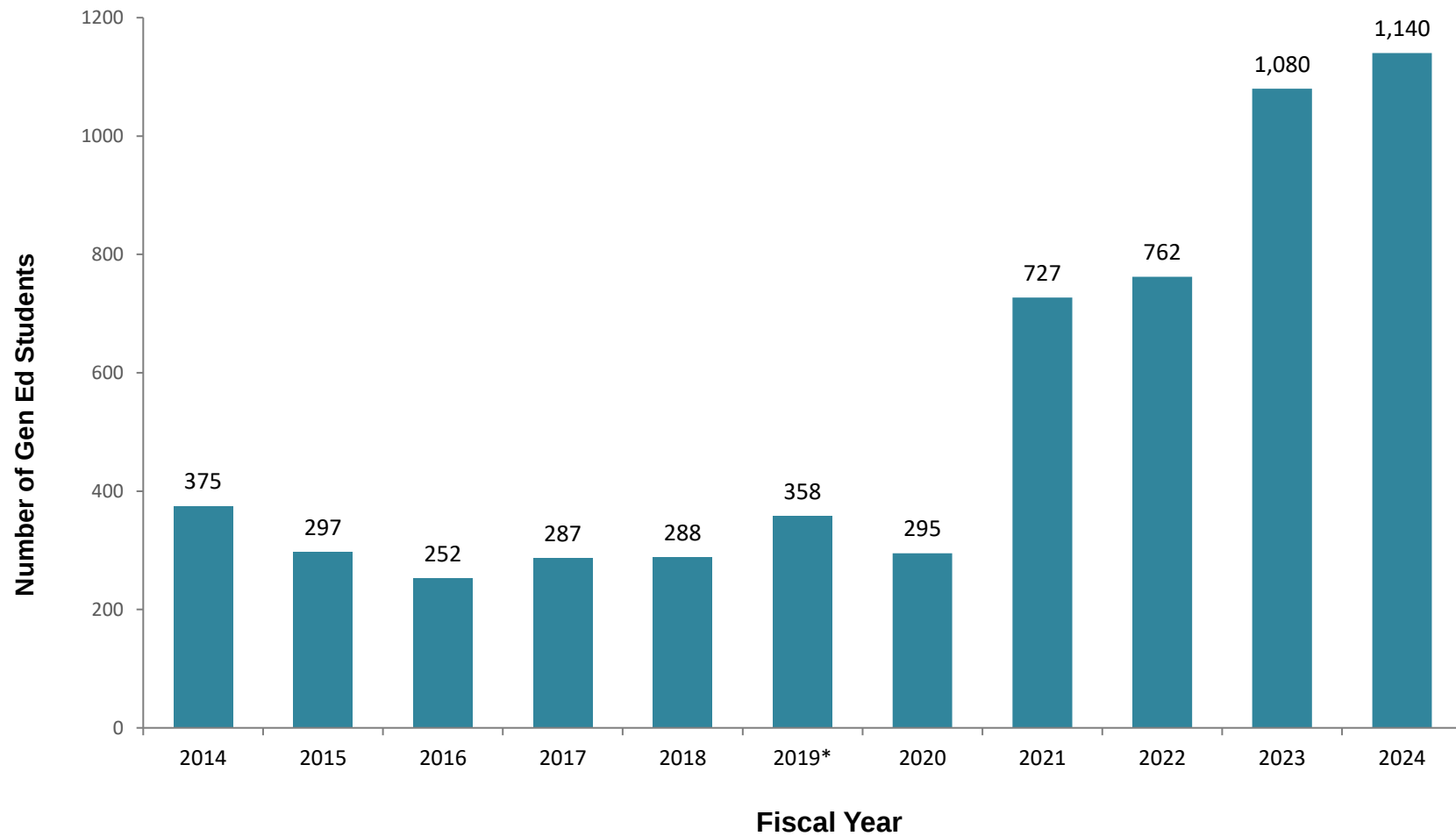


Number of High School Students Enrolled in

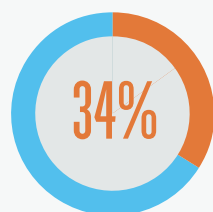

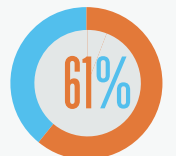
